



Bishop-Elect Thomas James Brown
Episcopal Diocese of Maine

For the past ten years, Bishop-Elect Thomas James Brown served as the rector at the Parish of the Epiphany in Winchester, Massachusetts. A native of Michigan, Brown received his Master of Divinity from the Church Divinity School of the Pacific in Berkeley, California, and was ordained in 1998.

In addition to his service at the Parish of the Epiphany, Bishop-Elect Brown served as rector of St. Michael's Episcopal Church in Brattleboro, Vermont. He has held many leadership positions in The Episcopal Church and currently serves as trustee and chair of the Board of Trustees of the Church Pension Group in New York City.

The Rev. Thomas James Brown was elected to become the 10th Bishop of the Diocese of Maine at a Special Electing Convention held in Bangor February 9, 2019. Addressing the Convention following announcement of the voting results, Bishop-Elect Brown said, it has become “so clear to me that the church in Maine is living the Good News of Jesus Christ. I am humbled and overjoyed to accept the invitation to join the people of Maine as their bishop.”

The Bishop-Elect and his spouse, the Rev. Thomas Mousin, along with their dog Esther, have made their transition to Maine and reside in Portland.
